

HEC Montréal: Faculty Positions in International Business

The Department of International Business of the HEC Montréal (the business school of the University of Montreal) invites applications for faculty positions at all levels, tenured and tenure track, starting in July 2007.

Job Qualifications: Candidates should hold a doctorate in a relevant field or be close to completion. Candidates for associate or full professor should have an established record of quality research and teaching while candidates for assistant professor should be promising scholars. Successful candidates will be expected to publish research in major journals and to teach high-quality graduate and undergraduate courses. The department encourages applications from those active in international marketing, international strategy and international management.

About the School: Founded in 1907, HEC Montréal (www.hec.ca) is one of the oldest business schools in North America. It offers 31 programs in management studies from BBA to Ph.D., taught by 220 professors. Its MBA program is highly ranked among non-US business school world-wide by Business Week and Forbes, and it is the only business school in North America to be accredited by the AACSB, EQUIS and AMBA.

Courses at HEC Montréal are primarily taught in French, with a growing number of courses also given in English and Spanish. Standard teaching loads for new PhDs are 3 courses (117 class hours) per year. Teaching and research facilities are excellent. Research publication is financially rewarded.
