

Associate/Assistant Professorship in International Business at Copenhagen Business School

The Department of International Economics and Management at Copenhagen Business School invites applications for a vacant Associate or Assistant Professorship in International Business. The Department conducts research and teaching within the following areas:

- Organization, management, and strategy in multinational companies
- International corporate governance
- Transition economies and emerging markets (INT is home to the Asia Research Centre as well as the Centre for East European Studies)

The associate professorship is a tenured position and the assistant professorship is a non-tenured 3-year position. Both include research and teaching obligations. The position can be filled at either assistant- or associate professor level depending on the qualifications of the applicants. Applicants are requested to specify what level they wish to be evaluated. The successful applicant is expected to be physically present for and actively participate in the teaching and research activities of the department.

Qualifications: The applicant must hold a PhD or the equivalent. Emphasis is placed on the applicant's research potential, which means that a researcher with a large research potential may be preferred to a researcher with a large research production. The successful applicant is obliged to participate in a special Copenhagen Business School development program on teaching principles and methods in order to fulfil the pedagogical requirements made at the end of the term of employment as assistant professor. The applicant should preferably have a basic knowledge of Danish society and culture, if the selected applicant does not speak Danish, CBS encourages her or him to acquire Command of the language within a couple of years.

Starting date: 1 January 2007 or soon thereafter

Salary range: 4300 Euros – 5000 Euros per month (51 000 – 60 000 Euros per annum).

Application deadline: 29 September 2006, 12.00 noon.
