The successful candidate will hold a Ph.D. at the time of appointment, a strong academic background, and provide evidence of a proven research record, or strong indication of research potential. Duties will include teaching of undergraduate and graduate courses, and undertaking an active research program. The Faculty offers honours undergraduate degrees in Commerce and Information Technology (with specialization in game development and entrepreneurship, networking and IT security). We also offer a Master of IT Security degree, the first of its kind in Canada.

Preference will be given to individuals with expertise in one or more of the following areas: entrepreneurship, strategic management, finance, accounting, and marketing.
