

Strategy and International Business Position, Fall 2010

The Sawyer Business School of Suffolk University invites applications for a full-time tenure track position in the Strategy and International Business Department as Assistant Professor beginning in the Fall 2010.

Many of our over 115 faculty members are engaged in research with an international focus. Faculty has opportunities to develop and lead travel seminars to overseas locations (such as China, UK, India, Brazil, Germany, etc.) and teach at our overseas campuses in Madrid (Spain) and Dakar (Senegal). The Department also houses the Center for Innovation and Change Leadership.

The person we hire will have a completed doctoral degree in strategy/ international business by August 2010, or soon thereafter. Demonstrated teaching excellence, refereed publication(s), and relevant business or professional experience will enhance the candidacy.
